

Two Measures of Obama's Faith

- Obama's Religious Identity (Pew): Now, thinking about Barack Obama's religious beliefs... do you happen to know what Barack Obama's religion is? Is he Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu, atheist, agnostic, or something else?
- Obama's Religious Beliefs (PRRI): From what you know, do you think Barack Obama has religious beliefs that are very similar, somewhat similar, somewhat different or very different than your own religious beliefs?




Perception of Barak Obama's Religious Identity


Perception of Obama's Religion by Religion

Perception of Obama's Religion by Party




Americans Less Likely to Believe that Obama is Christian

Perception of President Obama's Religion (2008-2010)




Drop in Personal Favorability Tracks Drop in Number who believe Obama is Christian

Favorable Views of Obama and Perception of his Religion




Relationship between Perceptions of Obama's Religious Identity and Job Approval



Mean Scores by Category










Views about Obama's Religious Beliefs By Party ID


Views about Obama's Religious Beliefs by Most Trusted Television News Source


Differences in Views of Obama's Religious Beliefs Among Republicans By Trusted Media Type



Predicted probability of viewing Obama unfavorably by Religious Attendance


Mean Scores by Category

Conclusions



- None of the analysis here addresses the direction of the relationship between perception of Obama's religion and his political and personal evaluations
- It is likely that favorability is affecting views about Obama's religion just as views about his religion are affecting his favorability
- Need for panel data

Differential Effects

 The analysis shows that Obama's religious beliefs matter more for some Americans and less for others, (i.e. white mainline Protestants, white evangelicals, frequent attenders)

Conclusions



- Being viewed as a Christian has nearly as large a positive impact as being viewed as Muslim has a negative impact
- These effects are true even among Non-Christians
