KEY INSIGHTS FROM PRRI'S 2024 AMERICAN VALUES ATLAS



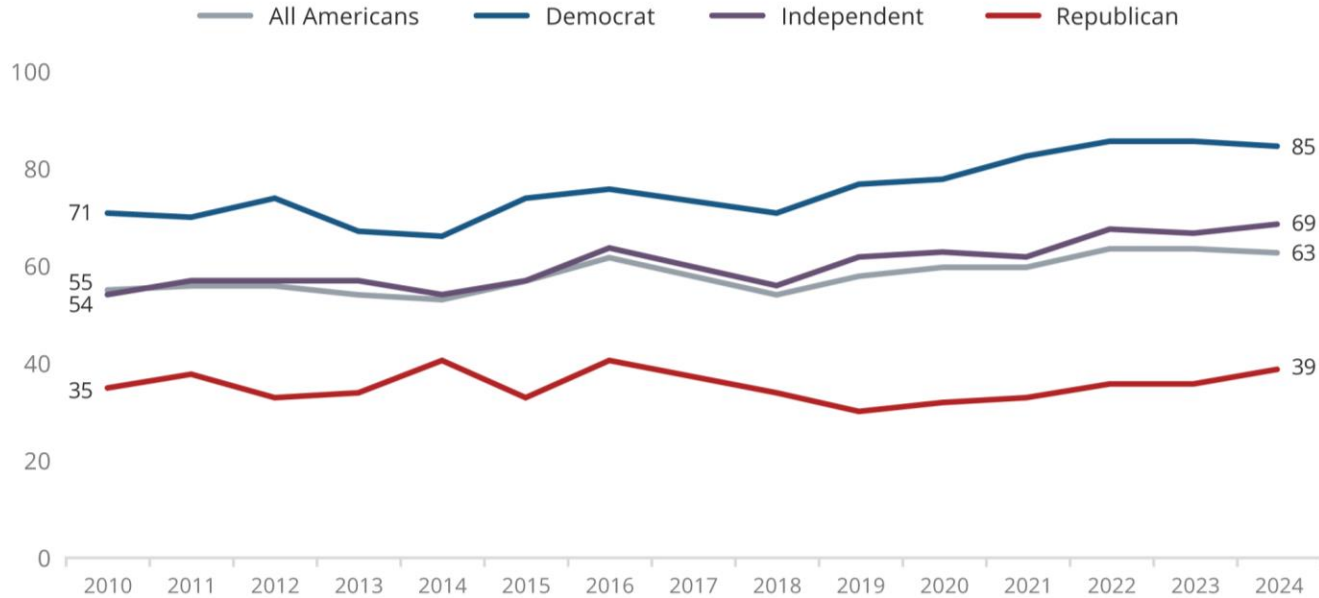
Survey Methodology

- Conducted March 13 - December 2, 2024, among a probability sample of 20,642 adults who are part of the Ipsos KnowledgePanel plus 1,618 state level opt-in oversamples, for a total sample of 22,260 adults.
- The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 0.84 percentage points and has a design effect of 1.6.
- The survey was made possible through the generous support of Michelle Mercer and Bruce Goldman.

Support for Abortion Legality, 2010-2024, by Party Affiliation

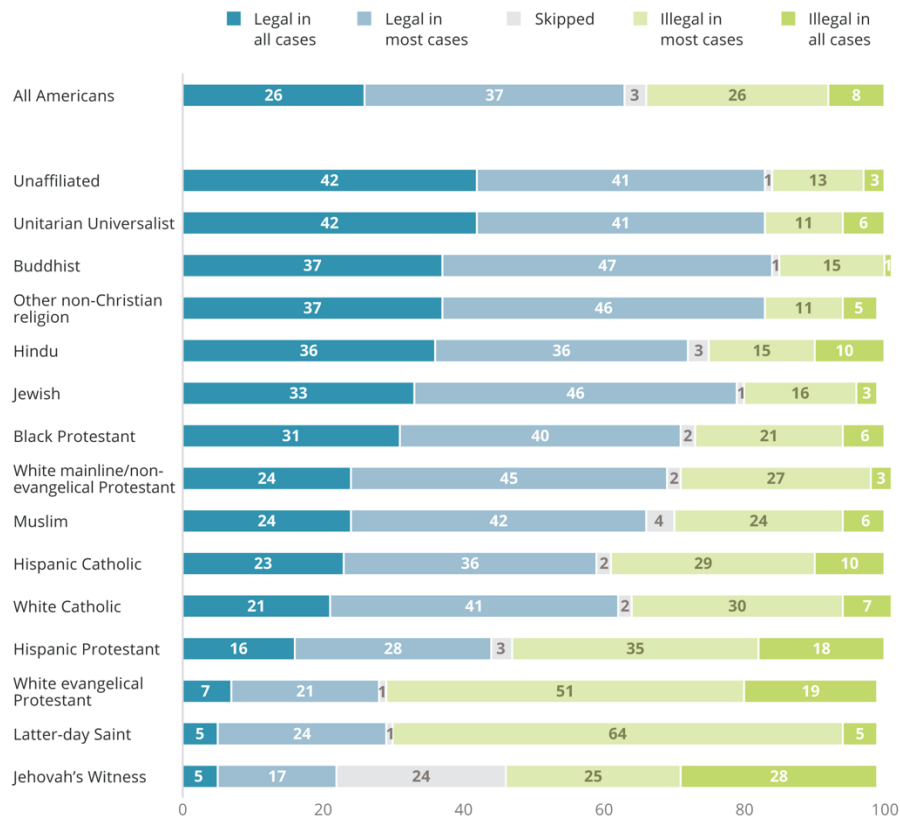
Percent who say abortion should be legal in most or all cases:

Percent who say abortion should be:

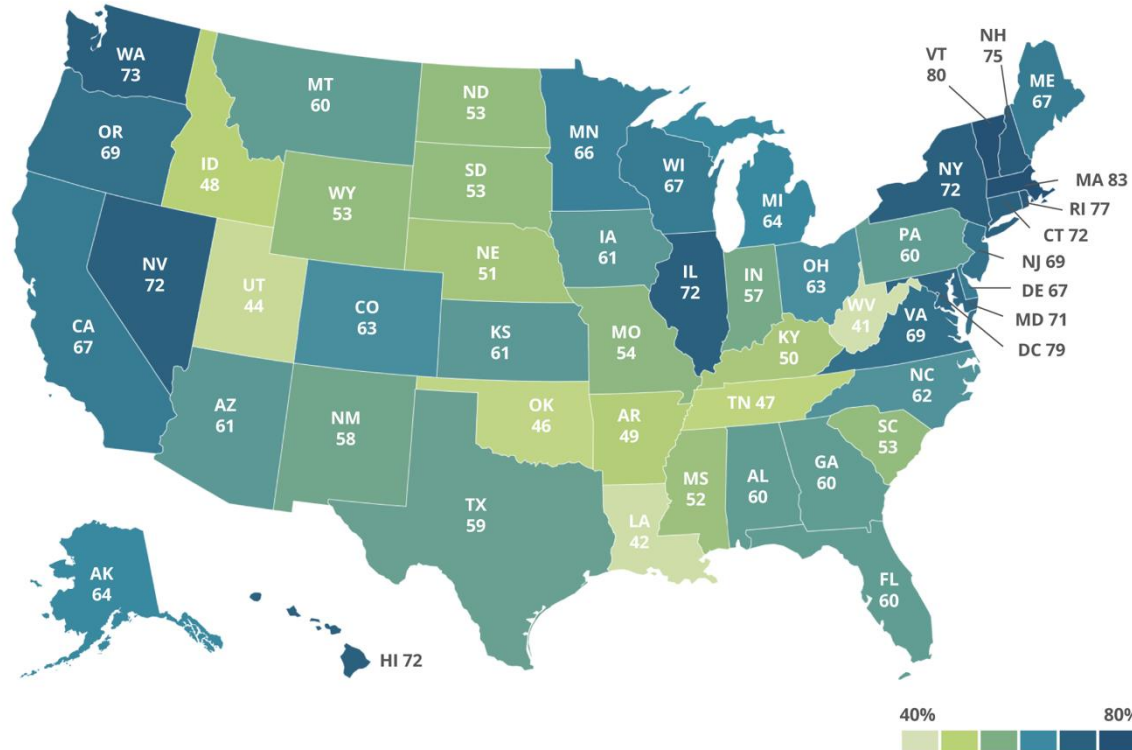

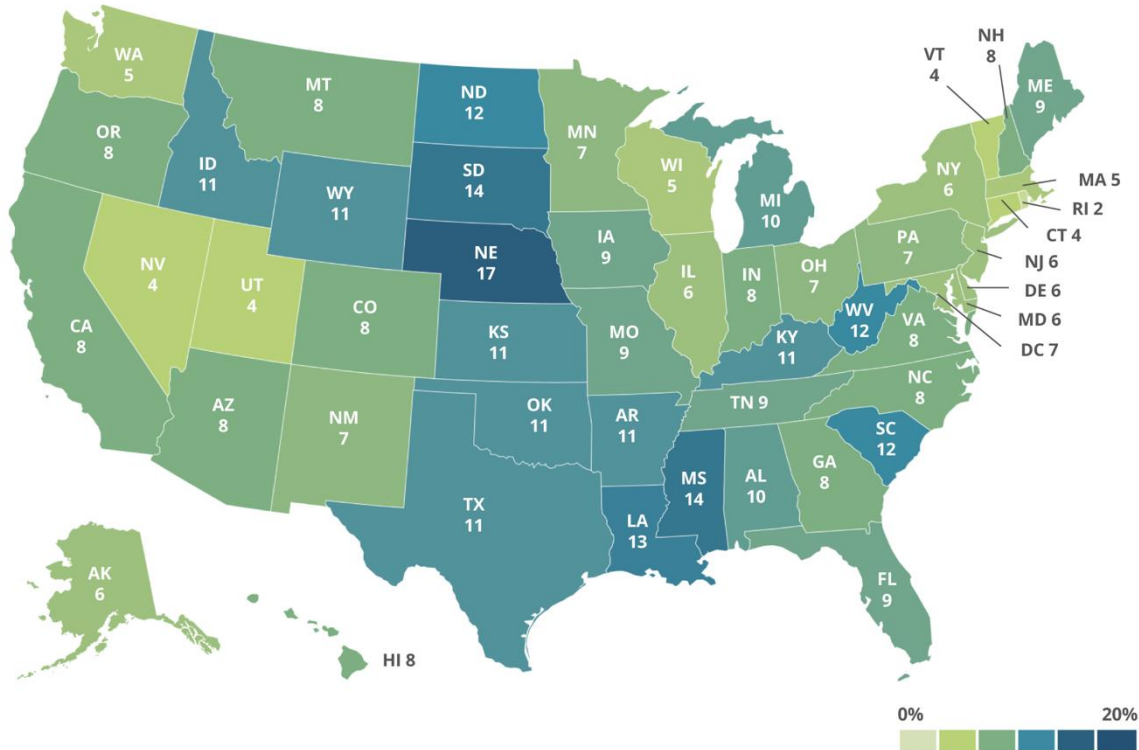
Support for Abortion Legality, by State

Percent who say abortion should be illegal in all cases:

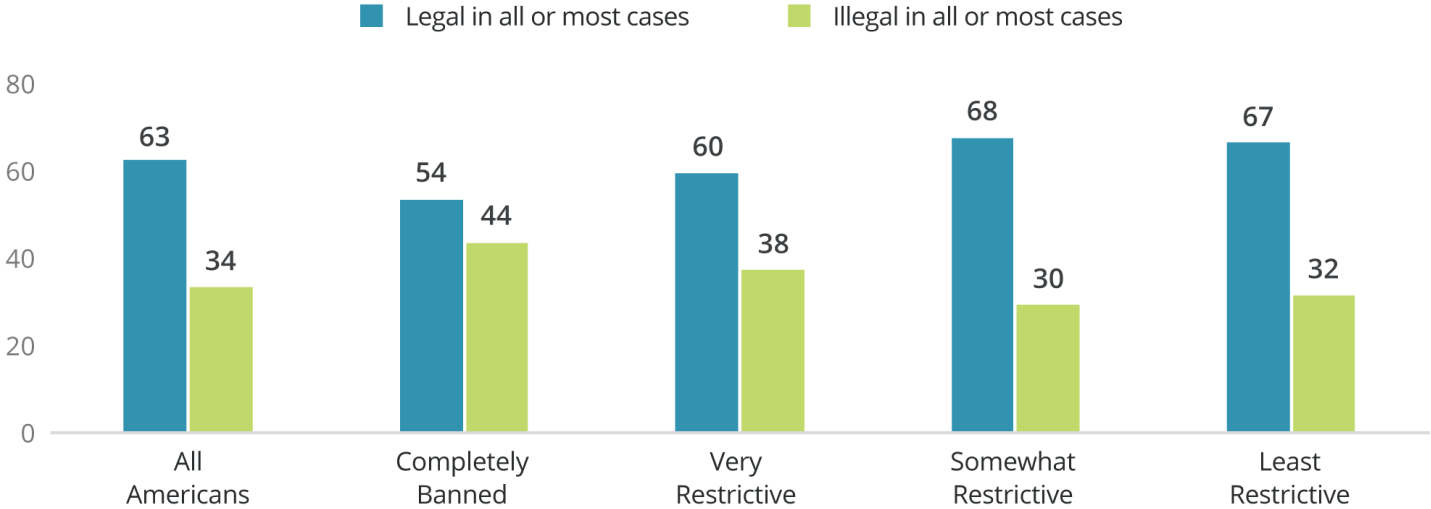


Classification of Abortion Legality Status, by State

Classification	States
Completely banned	Alabama, Arkansas, Idaho, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, West Virginia
Very restrictive gestational limits	Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Nebraska, North Carolina, Ohio, South Carolina, Utah
Somewhat restrictive gestational limits	Arizona, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Hawaii, Illinois, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Hampshire, New York, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Virginia, Washington, Wisconsin, Wyoming
Least restrictive	Alaska, Colorado, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, Oregon, Vermont, District of Columbia

Percent who think abortion should be:

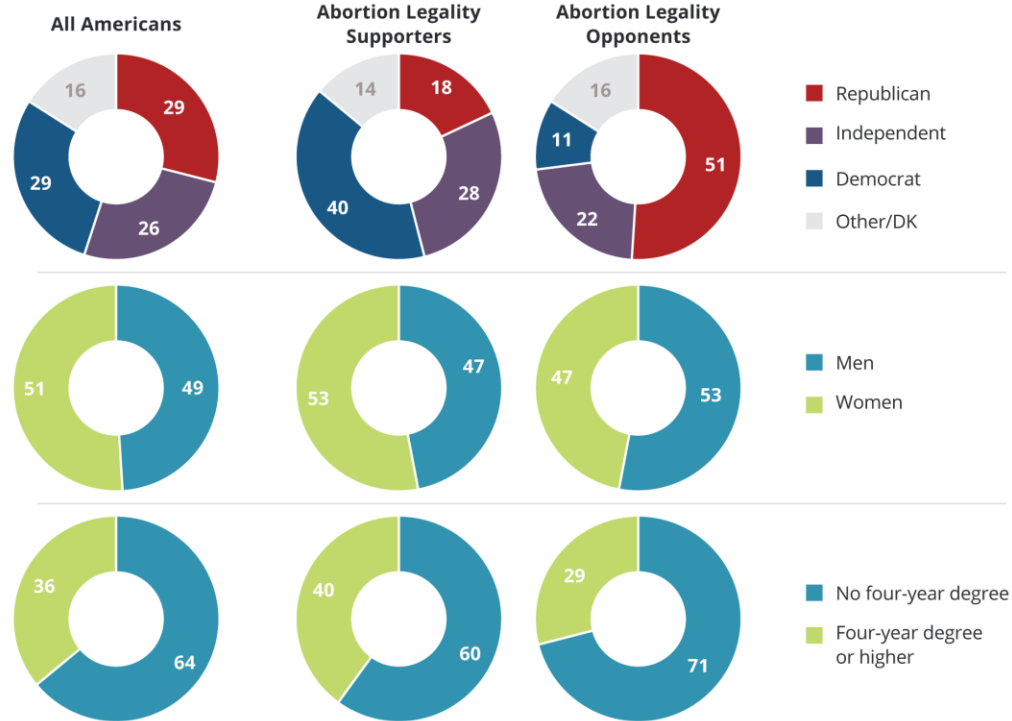

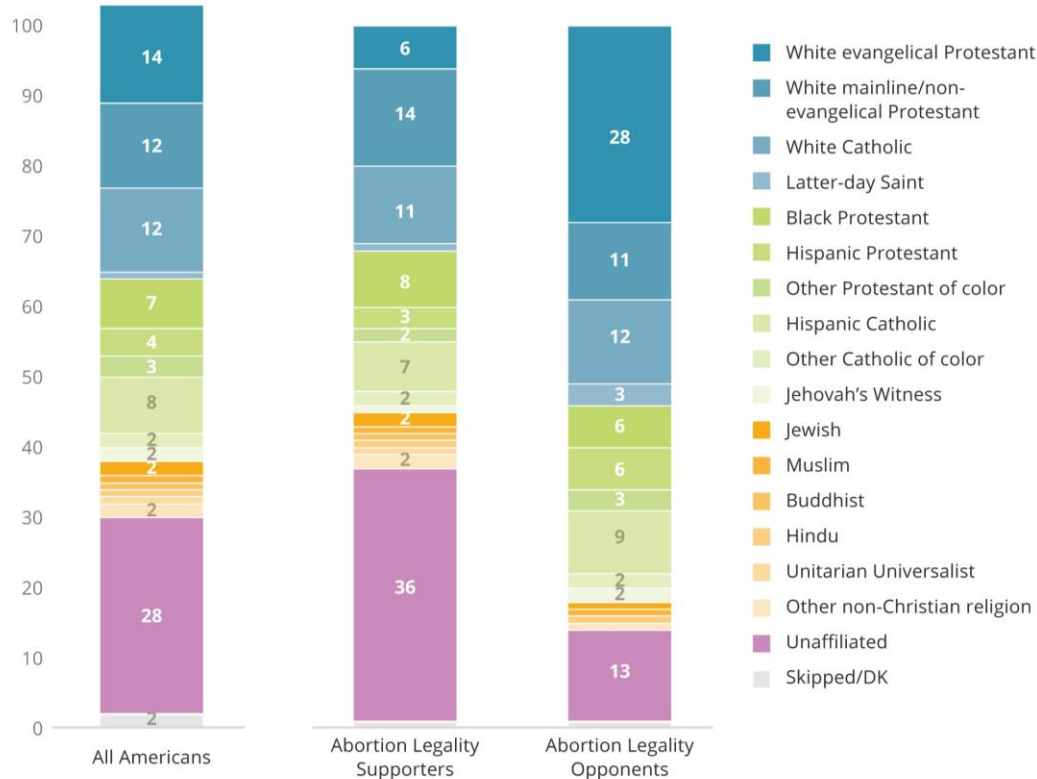

Religious Profile of Abortion Legality Supporters and Opponents

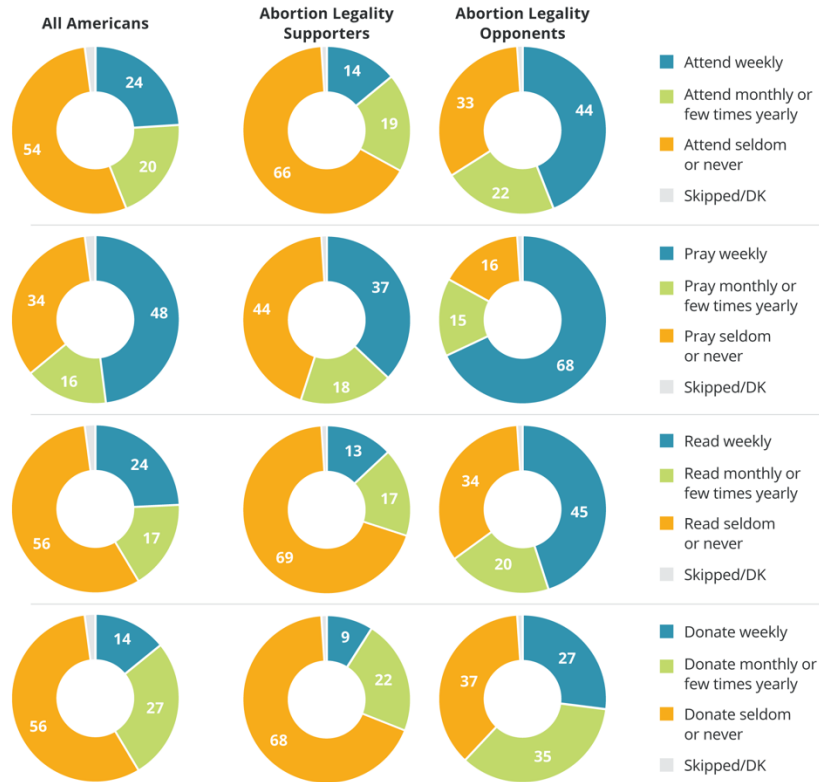

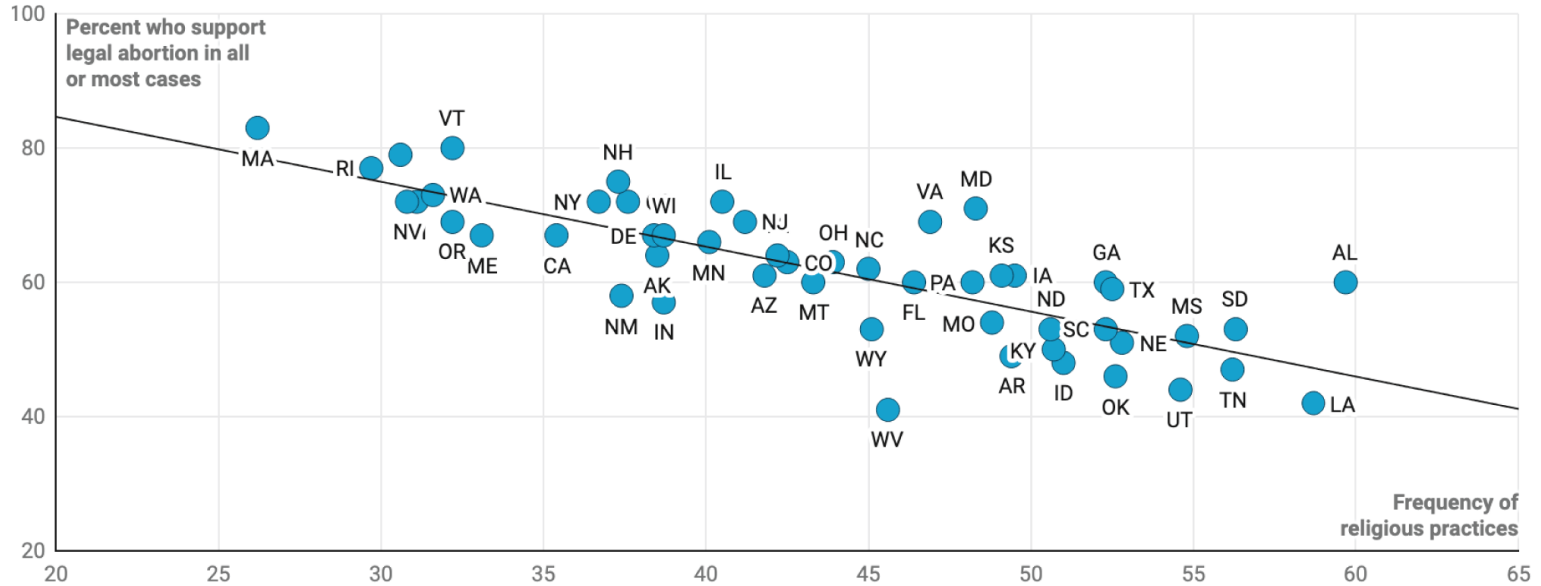
Religious Practices Profile of Abortion Legality Supporters and Opponents

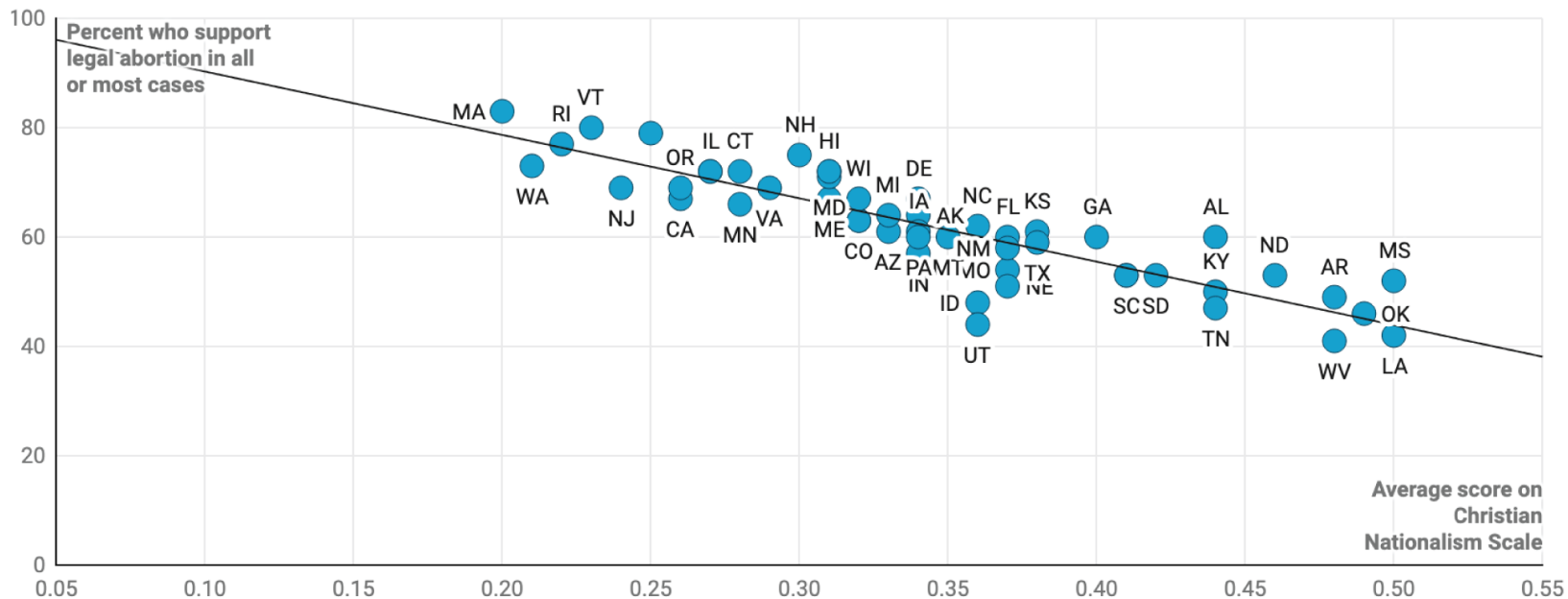
Religious Practices and Views on Abortion Legality

The Relationship Between Christian Nationalism and Support for Abortion Legality, by State

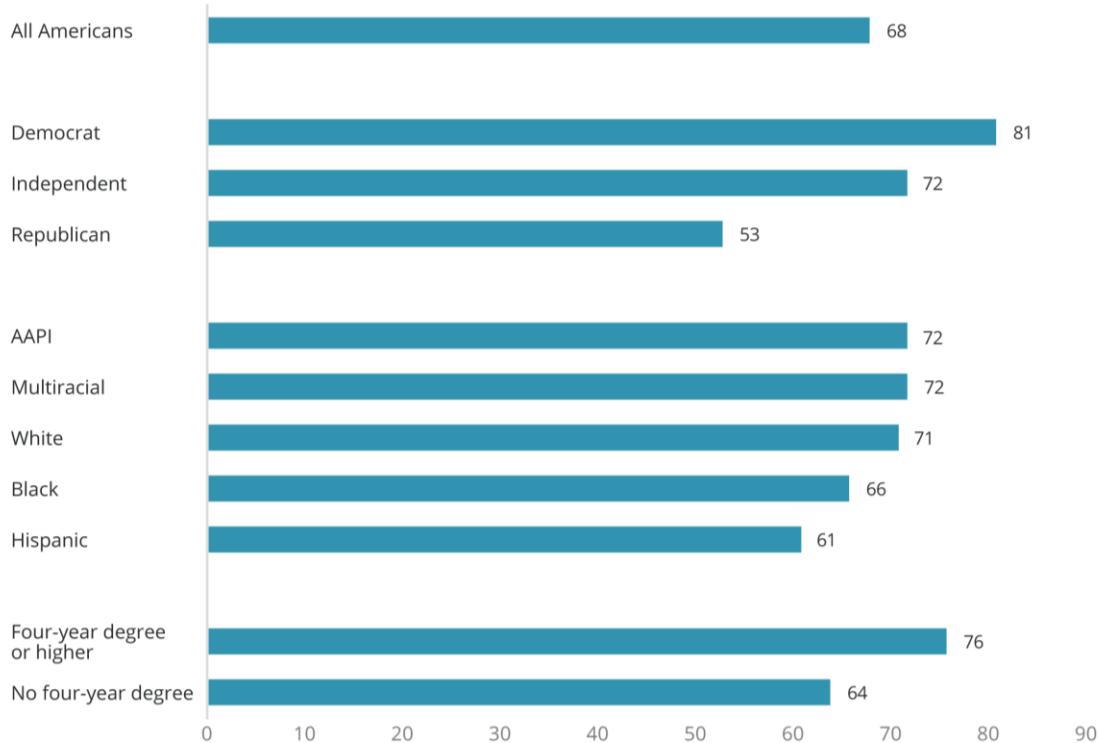

Opposition to Laws that Make it Illegal to Access Abortion Pills by Mail, by Party and Key Demographics

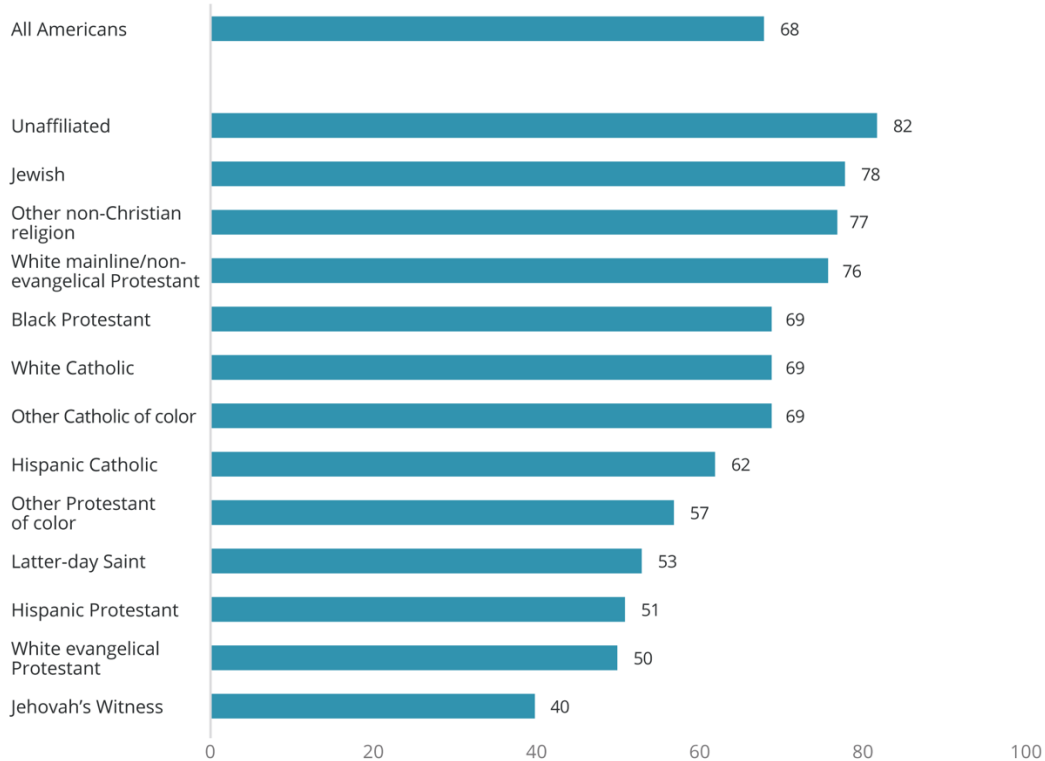
Percent who oppose laws that make it illegal to use or receive through the mail FDA-approved drugs, also known as the abortion pill, for a medical abortion:
